Managing

God's gifts

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

The biblical teaching of "stewardship" is often misunderstood in the life of the Christian and misapplied in the life of the church. When we hear the pastor, or other congregational leadership utter the dreaded "S-word," we may have a variety of unwanted reactions.

Some hear the term with glassy-eyed confusion, not certain what it really means. Who uses the word "stewardship" these days? Others hear the term and think, "Oh no! It's that time of year again. Others hear the word and, almost instinctively, clutch their pockets to protect them from prying hands. After all, "It's my money," they think. "It's nobody else's business what I do with my money; that's between me and God." Still others—including pastors—dread the annual stewardship campaign for fear of being perceived and labeled as "moneygrubbers." Believe it or not, most pastors do not even want to preach the dreaded "money sermon"!

The term "stewardship" often translates the Greek word *oikonomia*, which literally means "the management of a household or family." A "steward," then, is an *oikonomos*, or "one who manages a household." Perhaps "management" and "manager" would be more familiar—and more useful—terms. Lord then urges us to be faithful in what belongs to someone else with the result that we may be entrusted with "the true riches" (Luke 16:11) of eternal life (see Luke 16:10–13).

In *Managing God's Gifts*, we will explore how "stewardship" embraces all of life. First, we will ponder good management of God's created order, because "the earth is the LORD's and the fullness thereof" (Psalm 24:1). Next, we will explore how we can be "good stewards" (managers) in our relations with other people, serving them in our vocations and bearing their burdens (Galatians 6:2). Third, we will consider time as God's gift to be faithfully managed so that we may "be joyful and . . . do good as long as [we] live" (Ecclesiastes 3:12).

On November 9, we will begin an intentional three week reflection titled "*Managing God's Gifts*". A special Bible study will be guided by Ryan Berens during the Sunday School hour. Our reflection and stewardship invitation will culminate on Commitment Sunday as part of our worship on November 23 followed by a celebration Thanksgiving dinner after the 10:30am service. I hope you will be intentional about responding to this important invitation to join our family of faith as we build generous lives transforming Thanksgiving into Thanksliving.

Read Through the Bible in a Year Calendar

Scripture reading suggestions:

- 1) It's important to find yourself a regular time and quiet place to read the Bible; reading Scripture regularly and habitually gradually deepens your relationship with God. Remember, keep it simple. This is only a guide, not a rule. Use this to help hear and study God's Word.
- 2) Begin by praying. One very simple and good prayer to use is Psalm 119:18 "Open my eyes, so that I may see the wonderful truths in your Word."
- 3) Take some time to be quiet with God, to think about what you read yesterday, and to think again about what you learned from that reading.
- 4) Read the passage for the day. Think what the passage tells you. Some questions worth asking yourself are: 1. Does this passage tell a story? Or is it a prayer or a poem, or perhaps part of a letter? 2. What is it mainly about? 3. Does it tell me something about what God is like? Does it tell me something about how to live in response to God's love and plan for me?
- 5) Try to summarize what you have learned from the passage.
- 6) Is there something here that I don't understand, that I need to think about a lot more, or talk to someone else about, or perhaps even look for more information?
- 7) Take some more time to be quiet with God-don't just ask these questions once over, but think about them for a while. Think again about yesterday's reading-how do the things you learned yesterday fit with what you learned today?
- 8) Keeping a notebook of what you learn can be very helpful.
- 9) Did you know that.....When you carry the Bible, Satan has a headache. When he sees you reading it, he faints. Let's read the Bible every day so he keeps on fainting. Maybe one day he'll have a stroke and never wake up.




